

Minutes of the April 3, 2023 Robinson City Council Meeting, Approved

Robinson City Council held its regular monthly meeting on Monday, April 3, 2023 at the Community Center. Mayor Lieneman called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Councilpersons Traxler, Griswold, and Taylor and City Clerk Macy Bryant were in attendance. Also in attendance was Code Enforcement Officer James Traxler.

Committee/ Department Reports: March financials for the Fire department were approved.

Financials: None.

Administrative: Councilman Taylor motioned to approve the March 6, 2023 Minutes with corrections. Councilwoman Traxler seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Councilman Taylor motioned to approve the March 16, 2023 Minutes with corrections. Councilwoman Griswold seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Old Business: Councilwoman Griswold motioned to pass Ordinance 344-2023 allowing chickens in town with the purchase of a one time permit. Councilman Taylor seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Councilwoman Traxler motioned to set the chicken permit price at \$20.00. Councilwoman Griswold seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed. Chicken permits will be at City Hall.

New Business: Councilwoman Traxler motioned to move forward with the bid for electric work to be done by RS Electric with an estimate of \$28,363.59. Councilman Taylor seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Sewer rates will change on upcoming city bills for some households with the new rates being set by the average amount of water each household used from November 2022-February 2023. If you have any questions regarding your sewer bills please call City Hall. Councilwoman Traxler motioned to table raising the sewer rates. Councilman Taylor seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Brown County notified the city they would be increasing trash rates effective in May. Councilwoman Traxler motioned to raise the city trash rates by one dollar. Councilman Taylor seconded the motion. Councilwoman Griswold voted nay, motion passed.

Councilwoman Traxler motioned to keep Mark Lieneman on the board at Wholesale Water District No. 27. Councilman Taylor seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Building Permit Applications: Councilwoman Griswold motioned to approve a fence building permit for James Traxler. Councilman Taylor seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Code Enforcement Report: Several residents have been and will be contacted concerning vehicles and blight. One resident is working to get a permit for a fence. The ball park fence and dugouts are starting to age and could use updating.

City Clerk Report: The city does not have a maternity leave policy in place and will need to have one written up and voted on. City Hall will be closed on April 20, 2023. Councilwoman Griswold motioned to move the shutoff date to Friday, April 21, 2023. Councilwoman Traxler seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.
